Qualifying Information – Required for Each Club Sticker: Since late 2012, we now require the following information for each sticker requested:

- Year/Make/Model
- Insurance carrier/Policy Number/Expiration Date
- Plate # and Expiration Date

Stickers for machines must be placed on the left side rear fender next to the seat, or, on header panel below headlight (if visible to passing riders). The application also includes a copy of the club's code of conduct on the back of the membership form. Please read and sign that you have read it. The new application is available on club website to view.

Trail & Map Information

Dad's Diner parking lot is now reopened which is at the intersection of Route 104 and Route 3 in Hannibal. We still do have access from there over to Oswego St, behind Top's market. Unfortunately, the **Landowner** of the Tops property, **not Tops**, has not given us permission to access the store. We will continue to work on this.

Access to the entire Village of Hannibal has been granted on a **TRIAL** basis. We have access now from the trailhead on Oswego Street down into the Village. **(thanks to Susie for all her help with the memberships!!)**

Maps STILL Need Your Help by Hugh Howes The map committee could use your help to collect more raw data for conversion to a new map of our club trails. If you'd like to help, just use your cell phone while riding on the trails. Free apps are available to track your GPS coordinates while moving, whether walking, bicycling, boating, or ATVing. The app I like to use is Trail Tracker but others are in your app store too. There will of course be a learning curve involved but once you have the track data it can be exported out (emailed) and used to make a printable map. For conversion to a map, your raw data file must be in KML or KMZ format, so check for that when choosing a phone app; some won't work. Please email your file to OswegoValleyATV@hotmail.com . The map committee will then add your track to work already done and eventually we will all have an up-to-date map. Happy Trails to You!

Memberships

Single (individual) Membership: Cost is \$25 and only one club sticker will be issued. Qualifying information for ATV is required. (See next column)

Family Membership: Cost is \$30 and includes 2 adults and 1 child under 18 years of age and must reside in the same household. They must live in the household and be your children. If you have more children, we will issue up to an additional 2 stickers. Qualifying information for each ATV sticker issued is required.

Changes to the Membership Form -Please Read-

The membership form located on the club's website is a fillable PDF form. If you have access to a computer, please fill in the fillable form. Even if you renew at Susie's Quick Mart, fill it out ahead on your computer, print it out and take it with you to Susie's (it will save you time). If you want your information to be correctly read, the fillable form is your best option. Even though you may have very good handwriting, it is better to use the fillable form so that everything is entered correctly into the club's computer records, especially your email address. It will save us so much time because your information is individually entered and if we can't read it then we will try to figure it out or contact you; it all takes extra time and it may not be correct. Also, the upper right corner is no longer for "Club Use Only"; please mark if you are a new member or a renewing member. If you were EVER a member then you are a renewing member. Thank you.

In-Season Stickers / Trail Access Questions

REMINDER: Dirt Bikes are **NEVER** allowed on our trail system and club stickers should never be placed on a Dirt Bike. If you see a bike on our trails, get a good description of the individual and bike (plate if visible), then call law enforcement. DO NOT take matters into your own hands, doing so causes problems for both you and the club. Call the law first.

My Experience Working at Chicken BBQ's By Ann Howes
