Oswego Valley ATV Club is located northwest of Syracuse in Hannibal, NY, Oswego County. The Club maintains about 30 miles of family-oriented trails open to ATV riding from Hannibal, NY west to Fair Haven, NY and south to Cato, NY. Club membership is required to ride these trails, maintained by the Oswego Valley ATV Club. Membership forms can be obtained on our website at www.oswegovalleyatvclub.com or at the Hannibal Quick Mart. Please remember to stay on the designated trails and do not ride on any private property. These rules are being strictly enforced and you WILL be ticketed. Please also refer to our Code of Conduct available at our website. Trail maps are available to club members upon request.

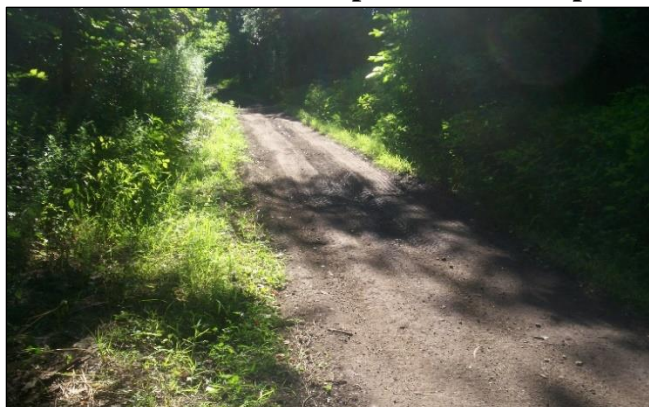
MEMBERSHIP & ID STICKER: Hannibal Quick Mart, 971 Cayuga St., Hannibal, NY 13074. Single membership \$25; Family membership \$30.

You can park and ride from four separate areas:

- 1) Muck Drive, Hannibal, NY
- 2) Hannibal, NY
- 3) Fair Haven, NY
- 4) Cato, NY

The trail between Fair Haven and Cato is an abandoned rail bed, a Cayuga County Trail that is part of the national Rails-To-Trails system. It is shared with walkers, runners, bicycles, dogs and horses. South of Fair Haven, the rail bed also branches east towards Hannibal, beyond which are more difficult ATV trails affectionately known as “The Badlands”.

Our trails are open from mid-April through the last weekend in September.

ATV RIDERS' RULES / CODE OF CONDUCT

1. Obey all laws, Federal, State and local. No excessive speed. Club stickers must be on the left side of rear fender of the machine, if possible.
2. Respect all people, real and personal property, wildlife and the environment.
3. Follow all rules of safety while riding our trails. Report any other rider that is not obeying club rules and state laws to a Club Officer.
4. Be courteous and careful while approaching others on our trails. Keep trails clean and safe. Let pedestrians, people with horses, bicycles and cars have the right of way. Turn off your machine if necessary near horses and other animals.
5. Club members shall not interfere or harass hunters, fishermen, sportsmen, landowners or other individuals in areas where they are riding.
6. Individuals who disobey the law or the club code of conduct may be subject to suspension or revocation of club membership and riding privileges.
